The enormous impact of our Wonder Web project persuaded the BBC Children in Need, Fun and Friendship fund to award grant funding for the second phase of this fantastic programme; Wac Arts Interactive.

All the young people involved in the forerunning Wonder Web project - also funded by Children in Need - benefited socially. The majority who turned 18 also progressed academically, moving on into higher education or employment.

And now Wac Arts Interactive has begun! A three-year project, it aims to work with 12-18 year olds from across the UK with mild and moderate disabilities. They will work with radio, television, animation, app development and even 3D printing. Often at risk of isolation, these young people will use technology to develop communication and independence skills whilst making friends and having fun!
