The new academic year begins with exciting news, developing a new Wac Arts Free School for 2014. Our Wac Arts Backers scheme is up and running now that individual giving becomes necessarily more crucial to our future. Hampstead Film Society announces its autumn film schedule and we have just completed a fantastic summer of activities for young people ranging from outdoor activity holidays and Circus School to our first residency at the celebrated Edinburgh Festival in August.

New Free School



Wac Arts has been announced as one of only 16 Alternative Free Schools in the UK. The Department of Education approved our application in recognition of more than 15 years re-engaging young people through creative activities. Of 300 applications, 102 were approved and only 16 were for alternative provision.

This means that Wac Arts will become a centre of excellence in the sector, delivering pioneering performing arts and media provision to young people who are failing to thrive in mainstream education. Providing bespoke educational opportunities for 14-19 year olds over the next five years, the school will be based at the Wac Arts centre in Belsize Park and will benefit both Camden residents and those from neighbouring boroughs. Young people will be encouraged and supported into further education, training and employment.

In developing our Backers individual giving scheme (see over) we are also supporting individuals in achieving their often extraordinary personal goals. Fundraising for a favourite charity can often be the extra motivation for exploring personal boundaries and achieving great heights. This summer Camille Curtis-y-Van-Dyke did literally that as she completed a long held ambition to skydive! She also raised over £1,000 sponsorship for Wac Arts!

Another celebrated fundraiser is Martha Stylianou. Her ambition to ascend the summit of Britain's third highest mountain, the Lake District's Helvellyn Ridge, was also achieved this summer. A full 950m above sea level, this was something she had always wanted to do and galvanized her family to join in the challenge. They took the steepest route and made it the top in an amazing four and a half hours! Biting winds made for a scary vantage point but all agreed they felt on top of the world – a truly exhilarating and unforgettable achievement!

Summer themes

Our outdoor activity Oasis residential projects in the countryside ran throughout the summer for young people with special educational needs and disabilities, with on-site Wonder Wac Arts activities. We also ran our much-loved Circus School for younger children, culminating in a circus to remember!

For older young people with music on their mind, there was a fantastic opportunity for guitar lovers, from complete novices to proficient players, to learn new acoustic guitar skills and form a guitar big band. The Musicus/Wac Arts Guitar School practiced, recorded and performed their work in a free, week-long course creating a distinct audible sound!

Edinburgh Festival success

Talented Wac Arts students and graduates performed to rave reviews at the prestigious Edinburgh Festival. With full houses every night, *The British Theatre Guide* said, 'This committed cast give strong, confident performances that are a delight to watch in a witty and engrossing play'; '... a compelling, original perspective on exile, conflict and learning what it means to be home' said *Broadway Baby.com*.

The play, A Concrete Jungle Full of Wild Cars by Mariama Ives-Moiba, won the Trinity International Playwriting Competition. The production was directed by Che Walker, a Wac Arts alumni and award-winning playwright.
