For the second year, Wac Arts have partnered with world renowned and industry respected <u>The Stage</u> to provide a scholarship place for one of our Diploma students. This is awarded to a first-year student who has displayed exceptional commitment to and ability on the course within the first term. Last year, the scholarship was awarded to Anais Lone, who first joined Wac Arts as a member of the Junior programme as a child, and has continued to show determination and talent through her training on the full time course.

We are delighted to announce that this year the scholarship was awarded to **Gibsa Bah**. Since joining us in September, Gibsa has impressed Wac Arts time and again with his performing abilities. He has shown true dedication to the course, travelling from his home in Birmingham each week to London to be able to join the full time performing arts course whilst also being a support for his family. After seeing his progress in just a couple of months, the team at Wac Arts and The Stage cannot wait to watch his journey and progress over the next 2.5 years. At only seventeen years old, it is clear he is destined for greatness.

On hearing he would receive The Stage Scholarship, Gibsa said: "I am please to have been chosen for The Stage Scholarship. I am dedicated to my training, travelling from Birmingham to north London every week to work as hard as I can. I chose Wac Arts because it has an exciting syllabus: aerial skills, African song and dance, puppetry and more, as well as traditional performing arts and musical theatre training. I have loved my first term here and want to work hard to be the best performers I can be by the time I graduate. Thank you to The Stage and the team at Wac Arts that selected me."

In addition to funding his training for a year, Gibsa was also invited to attend a celebratory photo shoot with scholarship winners from other Performing Arts schools around the country. He has also received an invitation to The Stage awards, getting to meet other industry professionals and begin to build contacts. He will be accompanied by his mother and Wac Arts' Director of Artistic Programmes, Raidene Carter.

Gibsa performed at Wac Arts 4<sup>th</sup> annual fundraiser, Dare to Dream on Sunday alongside a star cast of Wac Arts Alumni and Patrons. Professional actors and Wac Arts Patrons; Simon Callow (Actor and Director), Owen Teale (Game of Thrones), Danny Sapani (HBO's Penny Dreadful) and Martina Laird (Casualty, Holby City, RSC) celebrated the organisation and its young performers by in scenes based on the theme of aspiration.
