Towards the end of last year, Wac Arts received news of drastic cuts to its funding. This meant that its weekend programmes, the very heart of Wac Arts and where it all began, faced closure. But all was not lost. Thanks to the initiative and determination of the Wac Arts community, a Kickstarter campaign known as the Wac Arts Longevity Project was set up and in 30 days managed to raise the required £15,000 to keep the courses running for another term. This also gave some much needed breathing space to find the money needed to fund the rest of the year.



On April 6<sup>th</sup>, Senior Wac Arts students will be holding a presentation of their weeks of hard work made possible by this Kickstarter project. The evening will feature multidisciplinary collaborative performances from the students in an installation that will take over the Wac Arts building. It's a chance to witness directly the skill, passion and creativity that Wac Arts helps to nurture and develop in those who would otherwise not have access to such opportunities.

The evening starts at 6pm at Wac Arts, 213 Haverstock Hill, NW3 4QP. Tickets cost £5 (£3 concession) on the door.
