Wac Arts, an inclusive hothouse for creativity, turns 40.

Wac Arts celebrates 40 years of empowering young people to change their world through the arts. The celebration involves a weekend festival of inclusive arts activity and a show, directed by Ché Walker (the writer behind UK Netflix's hit Been So Long), performed by the graduating class of 2019.



To celebrate its 40th anniversary, **Wac Arts** is opening its doors. The charity has a rich history of supporting marginalised young people and has made Hampstead's **Old Town Hall**, with its rich history of social activism, its home. **Suffragettes** stood and rallied support, **Lord Pitt** gave an anti-racism speech and the **Nigerian Women's League** held their first dance at The Old Town Hall. The **Scratch Test Orchestra** and **Madness** played their first gigs at the hall, and, in the 70's, it was the place where the **Gay Liberation Front** held a disco, cementing Hampstead



as a place that actively supports LGBTQ+ rights. Wac Arts have built on this history to continue to support those who find it hard to participate in the arts.

'I can't express enough that if it wasn't for Wac Arts I wouldn't be where I am today. I owe it my whole career. Coming from my sort of background it's near on impossible to find any sort of avenue to pursue the art that we love' says ex-student and Eastenders' star, **Danny Dyer**.

Wac Arts present an 3-day festival of arts and events celebrating the rich heritage of change-makers who made history at the Old Town Hall. In keeping with a long and vital advocacy of marginalised people and change, the graduating musical theatre students will perform *In The Heights* at the Platform Theatre (6 - 7 July). *The We Are Wac Arts* (WAWA) Weekender festival will be held from 26 – 28 July. The public are invited to take part in discussions, workshops, performances and parties; allowing audiences and participants to explore, discover and celebrate the London Arts scene.

At the WAWA Weekender there will be many free events, from family activities to professional development workshops for emerging artists, as well as a participatory show curated by young people with disabilities that uses interactive technology developed at Wac Arts. Highlights also include; a late night party to celebrate Hampstead Town Hall's place in the history of supporting and celebrating the LGBTQ+ movement, with a DJ set by **Ana Matronic** (Scissor Sisters) and cabaret acts including; **Dolly Trolly Drag** and **London Gay Men's Chorus** and a special edition of **Ché Walkers**' Revolution, a show comprised of multiple acts from artists across different performing arts disciplines. Past acts have included; Olivier Award Winner Sheila Atim MBE, Hamilton lead Jamael Westman, OMAR, Danny Dyer, Simon Callow and Akala.
