# Wac Arts announces National Lottery support as it celebrates its 40<sup>th</sup> Birthday



Wac Arts has been awarded a £86,400 grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) to develop its Connecting Communities Project over its 40<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations. Wac Arts birthday year begins on the 23rd September with an Open Day for the public.

Made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, the Connecting Communities project is designed to celebrate the rich heritage of participation and performance of Wac Arts as a charity and the Old Town Hall of which they are custodians. The project will work with partners like University of the Third Age London and will engage 500 young people and their families, and 1,000 older Londoners.

Project highlights:

- For the first time, Wac Arts will make previously archived material available to the local community so that they can fully explore the building's history.
- Wac Arts will develop a heritage Skills Development programme for young people and a Volunteer programme, with expert input from Archivist Dr Ellie Pridgeon, Camden Archives, Heritage Specialists Unfinished Histories and Heritage Engagement Consultant Hopkins van Mil.
- The community will be welcomed into the Old Town Hall with a host of events starting with an Open Day on the 23<sup>rd</sup>September, three day arts festival, showcases, workshops and tours.
- The public will be invited to heritage-inspired performances and tours and an exhibition with dedicated displays and sound recordings throughout the building. The first of the Town Hall Tours will be at the Wac Arts Open Day on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2018 at 10am.

'When I took over as Chief Executive I made a commitment to connect with our wider community the 42% of Camden who are over 65, the asylum seekers and refugees seeking new homes here and those under 16 who often don't engage with arts organisations.
