JOB SUMMARY

Wac Arts is seeking a dynamic and versatile Dance Tutor to deliver engaging, inclusive, and age-appropriate dance sessions to three groups of students aged **4–6**, **7–11**, and **12–15** years on Saturdays, during term time, from 20th September 2025.

The role requires experience and confidence in teaching **street dance, contemporary, musical theatre, and pop/commercial dance styles.** The ideal candidate will be passionate about youth arts education, understand developmental differences across age ranges, and be committed to supporting the creative voice and confidence of every child.

SUMMARY OF KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

The following sets out the key responsibilities and is not intended as an exhaustive list. The role will require other duties relevant to providing a high-quality service.



Quality

- Provide high-quality Dance classes as part of the established Digital Arts programme; working with the Programme Manager to plan an exciting and enriching curriculum for the academic year
- Plan and deliver weekly 60 minute dance classes for each age group, ensuring the content is developmentally appropriate and creatively inspiring
- Teach in a range of styles including street, contemporary, musical theatre, and pop/commercial dance
- Create a positive and supportive learning environment for all participants
- Support students in developing physical coordination, musicality, creativity, performance skills, and teamwork
- Contribute to termly sharings or end-of-term performances
- Collaborate with other Wac Arts' tutors and staff to deliver a cohesive performing arts experience
- Engage participants and encourage participants' retention
- Attend briefings, training sessions, and planning meetings where required
- Complete necessary admin such as registers, risk assessments, and progress feedback and evaluations

Inclusion

- Ensure an inclusive environment, tailoring activity to meet the needs of all participants
- Adapt content to meet the needs of children and young people with additional needs or from diverse backgrounds
- Assess participants' physical conditions, capabilities and limitations
- Get to know participants and their individual needs and adaptations required
- Provide compassionate, clear and helpful feedback and advice to participants on their skills and techniques

Safety

- A good understanding of health and safety, studio etiquette and maintaining a clean studio environment is also expected. Including checking the area for safety and reporting any risks.
- Ensure registers and any other relevant paperwork is completed for your activity and returned promptly to your line manager.

- Ability to plan and deliver energetic, structured, and imaginative dance lessons
- The ability to choreograph, teach and rehearse young participants so that they are ready for performance in an inclusive and mixed discipline end of term show.
- Excellent class management and behaviour management skills
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills with young people, parents/carers, and colleagues
- A collaborative team player with a flexible and creative approach
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Understanding of safeguarding principles and child protection procedures
- An inclusive and accessible approach to working with young people of varying abilities and backgrounds

- Experience working in community, youth, or inclusive arts settings
