Job Description:

Wac Arts is seeking a passionate and energetic Dance Assistant (Tutor) to support the delivery of dynamic and inclusive dance sessions for young people. The successful candidate will assist lead tutors in delivering classes, help manage the learning environment, and inspire students to develop their skills and confidence in a range of dance styles. The role requires experience and confidence in **street dance, contemporary, musical theatre, and pop/commercial dance styles.** This is an excellent opportunity for someone at the early stages of their teaching journey who is eager to grow within a creative and supportive arts education environment.

Support the lead tutor in planning and delivering dance sessions



- Engage and motivate students across diverse age groups and backgrounds
- Demonstrate choreography and support students with technique
- Contribute to a safe, inclusive, and inspiring learning space
- Provide feedback and encouragement to students

- Lead warmups, or portions of the session as directed by the Programme Tutor
- Reflect upon and respond to feedback
- Assist with materials, playback and/ or tech support during the session
- Proactively engage students in the class and assist them with their learning
- Provide compassionate, clear and helpful feedback to participants and parents (where necessary)
- Engage in feedback and planning for future Wac Arts activity



Inclusion

- Ensure an inclusive environment, tailoring activity to meet the needs of all participants
- Assess participants' physical conditions, capabilities and limitations
- Assist the tutor with classroom management and behavioural standards
- Supervise students when the Programme Tutor is out of the room
- Be present and focused on the young people in sessions
- Provide compassionate, clear and helpful feedback and advice to participants on their technique and practice

Safety

- Ensure registers and any other relevant paperwork is completed for your activity and returned promptly to your line manager.
- Report and record any issues surrounding slips/trips/falls and safeguarding according to the Wac Arts Policy and procedures
