JOB SUMMARY

Wac Arts is seeking a skilled and enthusiastic Djembe Tutor to deliver fun, age-appropriate, engaging and culturally rich drumming sessions for three age groups: aged **4-6**, **7–11 years and adults** on **Saturdays**, **during term time**, **from 20**th **September 2025**. The successful candidate will inspire learners of all levels to develop rhythm, hand technique, and ensemble skills in a supportive and lively environment rooted in West African musical traditions.

SUMMARY OF KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

The following sets out the key responsibilities and is not intended as an exhaustive list. The role will require other duties relevant to providing a high-quality service.

Quality

- Plan and deliver weekly Djembe sessions tailored to the developmental needs of each group (early years, primary-aged children, and adults).
- Introduce and develop skills in traditional West African rhythms, hand technique, counter rhythms, syncopation, and polyrhythms.
- Facilitate group ensemble work, encouraging listening, collaboration, and improvisation.
- Embed cultural context and understanding in each session.
- Ensure all activities are inclusive, accessible, and engaging for students of varying skill levels.
- Contribute to the preparation of end-of-term sharings or performances, where appropriate.
- Maintain positive classroom behaviour and follow Wac Arts safeguarding and health and safety policies.
- Prepare students for end-of-term sharings or presentations of their animated work
- Provide support and alternative techniques to encourage a diverse pool of knowledge and skillset
- Engage participants and encourage participants' rétention
- Complete administrative tasks such as attendance registers, session plans, and evaluations

Inclusion

- Create an inclusive environment, tailoring activity to meet the needs of all participants
- Assess participants' skill level, capabilities and limitations, and create lessons that are accessible and enriching
- Get to know participants and their individual needs and adaptations required
- Provide compassionate, clear and helpful feedback and advice to participants on their knowledge, skills and practice

Safety

- A good understanding of health and safety, equipment etiquette and maintaining a clean classroom environment is also expected. Including checking the area for safety and reporting any risks
- Ensure safeguarding, wellbeing, and inclusion practices are embedded into all teaching
- Ensure registers and any other relevant paperwork is completed for your activity and returned promptly to your line manager
- Report and record any issues surrounding accidents or injuries and safeguarding according to the Wac Arts Policy and procedures

- Strong practical knowledge of traditional rhythms, ensemble playing, and hand technique.
- Ability to engage and motivate young children, as well as adults.
- Excellent communication, interpersonal and classroom management skills.
- A clear understanding of cultural sensitivity and the historical roots of the Djembe tradition.
- A collaborative spirit and flexible approach to group needs and learning styles.
- Strong classroom and behaviour management skills
- Ability to adapt teaching methods for different age groups and learning styles
- A supportive and inclusive teaching approach
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills with young people, colleagues, and parents/carers
- Understanding of safeguarding principles and child protection procedures
- Flexible approach to teaching and adapting classes to individual needs
- Ability to plan and design engaging and age-appropriate classes

Desirable

- Training in safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults
- First Aid certificate
- Enhanced DBS check (or willingness to undergo one via Wac Arts)
- Experience working in community or inclusive arts settings
- Experience with film editing and sound design to support animated projects
