We are delighted to be delivering Listen Up! a spoken word project for Camden Primary Schools for a second consecutive year.

Listen Up! is a spoken word programme from Wac Arts facilitated by Write2Speak poets. Through a series of in-school workshops pupils will develop creative writing skills, performance techniques, and explore themes of public space, heritage and identity. The project will culminate in a final sharing for family and friends at Wac Arts, Old Town Hall, Hampstead.

Participating schools will also receive free digital resources and a printed poetry booklet celebrating pupil's work.

THE OLD TOWN HALL

This project is inspired by our beautiful home, The Old Town Hall, Hampstead which has served as a venue for key political and social events for nearly 150 years. Through equipping pupils with the skills to explore topics and issues that are important to them, the celebratory sharing will see the building used as a platform for the next generation to express themselves.



WHY TAKE PART?

The project is aimed at year 5 and 6 classes in the borough of Camden.

As well as producing projects, performing, facilitating workshops and hosting open-mic events, Yossi is currently teaching Spoken Word as a Visiting Lecturer on the World Performance BA (Hons) & Stage Combat BA (Hons) courses at East 15 Drama school.

Tyler Cunningham - Lead Facilitator

Tyler is a highly accredited actor, singer, dancer and practitioner of performance education. Tyler first stepped on stage at the Royal Festival Hall aged 9, as part of a Gospel Concert. Since then he has gone on to work across the globe in stage, screen and musical performance. His work so far includes: Spider Man Far From Home (Marvel), Boy Meets Girl (BBC), Summer in London (Theatre Royal Stratford East), Flack (UKTV) and Holby City (BBC).

How can I apply on behalf of my school?

How many pupils can take part?

We are able to accept four classes of up to 30 pupils on the programme. Both one form and two form entry schools are encouraged to apply.

When will the workshops take place?

The workshops will take place during the school day either during the morning or afternoon. We will work with participating schools to establish suitable timings.

What will the performance involve?

The performance is an opportunity for each pupil to perform the work they've created in a supportive environment. The performance will be hosted by professional poets and pupils will take turns to share the work they've created during the in-school workshops.

When will the performance take place?

There will be two performance slots on Wednesday 9 December to ensure everyone involved has the opportunity to perform in the Old Town Hall. The performances will take place at **11:00** and **13:30** with schools arriving 45 minutes before their performance slot for an introduction to the space and a warm up.

Please note that each class will only take part in one of the performance slots.

The performance will be open to family and friends to attend and you will be provided with a ticket link to share ahead of the event.
